- 7** **Evansville Museum of Arts, History & Science**
411 Southeast Riverside Dr.
Founded in 1904, the museum is a general-interest museum with comprehensive collections in art, history, anthropology and science.
- 8** **Evansville Museum Transportation Center**
The Evansville Museum Transportation Center traces the history of transportation and features locomotives.
- 9** **Four Freedoms Monument**
The Four Freedoms Monument was built in 1979 to commemorate the United States' bicentennial.
- 10** **Franklin Street**
Franklin Street allows access to the Pigeon Creek Greenway Passage. During the first full week in October, Franklin Street is the site of the annual West Side Nut Club Fall Festival.
- 11** **Haynie's Corner Arts District**
Centered around Haynie's Corner, the district is resided mainly by artists.
- 12** **Joan Marchand Bridge**
411 Southeast Riverside Dr.
The 1891-built Joan Marchand Bridge has been recently restored, painted bright red, and converted into an Ohio River overlook with benches and bicycle racks.
- 13** **Koch Family Children's Museum of Evansville**
22 Southeast Fifth St.
An interactive children's museum built within a historic Art Deco building.
- 14** **Lamasco Skate Park**
W. Delaware St.
Lamasco Skate Park is located along the Pigeon Creek Greenway Passage, and contains half pipes, pyramids, a flat rail, a mini ramp with spine and two round rails.
- 15** **The Old Vanderburgh County Courthouse**
201 Northwest Fourth St.
Constructed in 1890, the "Old Courthouse," was once the center of Vanderburgh County, Indiana government.
- 16** **Pagoda/Visitors Center**
401 Southeast Riverside Dr.
Built in 1912 and restored in 1995, the Pagoda retains its original Japanese architectural design conceived from a model at the World's Columbian Exposition in Chicago in 1893.
- 17** **Pigeon Creek Greenway Passage**
42-mile pedestrian & biking trail throughout Evansville & Vanderburgh County.
- 18** **Reitz Home and Museum**
224 Southeast First St.
The historic Reitz Home Museum is noted as one of the country's finest examples of French Second Empire architecture.
- 19** **Dress Plaza/Riverfront**
A brick paved walkway above and tiered seating below provide a setting to view the Ohio River. The Riverfront invites walkers, runners, bikers and strollers.
- 20** **Shirley James Gateway Plaza**
1501 West John St.
Named after Shirley W. James, for her dedication and service for the Greenway Passage.
- 21** **Sunrise Park**
Sunrise Park sits on the Pigeon Creek Greenway Passage, and contains a playground and Sunrise Gardens.
- 22** **Sunset Park**
Sunset Park contains tennis courts and sits along the Pigeon Creek Greenway Passage.
- 23** **The Centre**
715 Locust St.
A 280,000-sq-ft convention center and auditorium.
- 24** **The Ford Center**
1 Southeast Martin Luther King Jr. Blvd.
A multi-use indoor arena in downtown, opened in 2011.
- 25** **Veterans Memorial Coliseum**
307 Market St.
The Coliseum was built in 1918 to honor veterans who fought in the Civil War and Spanish-American War, and it is now used as an events venue.
- 26** **Victory Theatre**
600-614 Main St.
Opened on June 16, 1921, The Victory Theatre is a 1,950 seat venue located on Evansville's Main Street.
- 27** **Willard Library**
21 North First Ave.
The Willard Library is a historic private donation library.

UPGRADE BY WALKING IN EVANSVILLE

Take steps toward a healthier lifestyle while exploring the sites of the city. This walking map will direct you to 27 locations within walking distance of downtown. It is designed to accompany a system of signs placed throughout the city to help you count your steps to points of interest in the area. Current physical activity guidelines recommend walking at least 10,000 steps per day.

- 1 Alhambra Theatre**
50 Adams Ave.
 A historic movie theater in the Haynie's Corner Arts District, built in 1913.
- 2 Bosse Field**
1701 North Main St.
 Built in 1915, Bosse Field is the third oldest ballpark used for professional baseball on a regular basis in the country. It is the current home of the Frontier League Evansville Otters, a minor league baseball team.
- 3 Central Library**
200 Southeast Martin Luther King Jr. Blvd.
 Central Library is a branch of the Evansville Vanderburgh Public Library system. The 145,000 square foot Central Library building opened in September of 2004.
- 4 Downtown YMCA Bike Rental**
222 Northwest Sixth St.
 Bicycle rental is now available at the Downtown Y. Adult and child size bicycles and helmets are available. Commuter bicycle lockers are also available at the corner of Sixth Street and Court Street.
- 5 Evansville African American Museum**
579 South Garvin St.
 A resource and cultural center dedicated to collecting, preserving and interpreting the history and traditions of African American families, organizations and communities.
- 6 Evansville Civic Center**
1 Northwest Martin Luther King Jr. Blvd.
 The location of all city offices for the City of Evansville and County of Vanderburgh.
